Three Nights Together—One's Left

Jerram Barrs, professor of Christian Studies and Contemporary Culture at Covenant Seminary was with us this past Wednesday, challenging us to cooperate with God in bringing people to a saving knowledge of his Son, Jesus Christ, by developing relationships with them and finding good things in them to affirm and praise. Jerram helped us take fresh look at the way Jesus related to people who needed God in their lives, and challenged us to turn around and practice that in our small circles of influence.

So how do we do that—as individuals in the workplace, the classroom, the neighborhood, in our wider families? And how can we do that as a church family? That's what we will be thinking through and discussing together this Wednesday night at House Church, the last of our Three Nights Together. You need not have been at either of the first two nights to get something from this conversation, so come anyway, even if you didn't hear Jerram or do not participate regularly in a community group.

The night will be led by the community group leaders, so it should be a good time together. We will eat a potluck supper at 6 p.m. (bring a dish to share, whatever!) and then our conversation together will begin with worship at 7 p.m. Childcare is provided but you need to sign up for it this morning.

Biloxi Update

Here's an update regarding the work in Biloxi where our team worked last fall.

January 28, 2008

Dear Fellow Pilgrims,

It's hard to believe that in just two months this work is scheduled to be over. The Lord has been gracious toward us and we are full, actually overfull, with volunteers for the rest of our time here except for next week. We have enough money to operate until we close. Let me explain this by saying that while we have enough money to finish out our work until we close, we could use millions of dollars more to help buy materials for other volunteer organizations and homeowners who lack money to buy building materials. So continue to send all the money you can. As we receive additional donations, we will use the money to buy supplies for both homeowners doing their own work and other volunteer organizations who lack sufficient funds to buy building materials.

I must share how the Lord has abundantly supplied finances for His work here. For example, we have never charged any fees for our volunteers to come and work here. We have as Malachi 3:10 says, tested God, and He has been faithful. He has indeed opened the windows of heaven for us and poured down blessings. It has been an awesome experience to witness how God has provided for this work.

In addition to money, there is something else you can do to help us here, and that is to pray for us to have a strong finish to this work. Beginning Feb. 23 through March 15, we have so many workers coming that I am seeking ways to make sure they are all kept busy doing productive jobs. Pray that my plans are God's plans so that they work out, pray that we would be most productive in our construction efforts, and pray especially that we would be effective in sharing the Gospel.

There are two people that I wish you would pray for the Lord to enable us to reach with the Gospel. Joe is a man around sixty years old, who has severe heart problems. We helped him a few months ago and he was willing to let us share Scripture with him. Pray for someone to reach out to him and for the Lord to give him and his family eternal life. Lucy is a lady of about 50, who we are currently helping get back into her house. She also is receptive to discussing Scripture. She is very lonely and she has attended one Bible class here at the church. Pray for Lucy's salvation.

Pray for Norman a man who has recently made a profession of faith in Jesus. Pray for someone to follow up and disciple him. We have not seen him at church for several weeks, and he has young children who would like to be here on Wednesday evenings to attend Pioneer clubs.

Even though this worksite is closing, the need for volunteers to continue to come to the coast continues. The situation is quite desperate for many people because their only hope for help is from the Church, and, many of the churches are rapidly closing down their volunteer efforts. There are still wonderful opportunities to continue to show the people of the Gulf Coast that God loves them. Below is some information about ongoing Katrina Worksites which I have visited in the greater New Orleans area that I think are worthy of all the support you can give.

The first one is working with Redeemer Presbyterian Church; a PCA church which is working on becoming a lighthouse to the community. This church could use financial help to pay its own

bills and also to help finance their community rebuilding efforts. I encourage you to do all you can to see this church thrive, in a city needing more Bible preaching churches. Trinity Church in Covington, Louisiana is another church doing a great work and very worthy of support. They work in the Covington area and also in New Orleans. They need volunteers and financial contributions. The Louisiana worksites are both trying to reach people with the Gospel as well as rebuilding houses. I hope you will continue to support the ongoing relief work taking place here on the Gulf Coast. If you can't come to work in Louisiana, please consider making financial gifts to these two churches. It takes a lot of money to rebuild houses and the people they help have very little money.

Mary Lee and I are continuing to look forward to life after Katrina, and we feel God calling us to foreign mission work. We have just sent an application to the African Bible College to see if we are the people God would have fill a position in Uganda. We ask that you pray along with us that God would make His plan for us clear. We realize that it isn't a normal thing for people of our ages and health to head off for the mission field, but we trust that God can use us despite our frailties.
