The next Sunday School classes will begin Sunday, September 14.

Isn't that a long way off? Yes it is--and here's the explanation for it. Pastor Mark always gets his teachers for the children/teen classes together during the Sunday School hour the week BEFORE classes begin to brief them and orient them for the semester. So that we don't risk people being away, we like to stay away from having that teachers' meeting on a holiday weekend. This year the Labor Day weekend takes in Sunday, August 31--which means the teachers' meeting will be the following Sunday, September 7, from 9-10am, and so the first class will begin the following Sunday, September 14.

But it's never really been effective in drawing kids from VBS so this year we debated what to do and decided not to invest a lot of time in pulling something together that hadn't really worked well but instead just to wait for the fall term of Sunday School in September.

What about adult classes? We have one adult Sunday School class planned which we will announce next Sunday, and are contemplating a second one. That class (or those classes) will also begin on September 14. The New Members' Class will start in January.

Sons & Daughters

I am the youngest child of Percy and Cecilia Gibbar; I was born in April of 1954. Both of my parents were Catholic and they raised us as such also. I believed in God from the start. Something about it all clicked with me and off I went.

Catechism was my bag and looking back at it I believe it was a good start. I guess that you could say that a seed was planted during this period. I hummed along all right for a number of years in this mode.

As I approached adolescent my dad became more irritable and distant to myself and the rest of the family. He somehow became afflicted with an emotional / mental problem that some of you may have heard of...Obsessive Compulsive Disorder. There was no name for it then, no real understanding of what and how the disorder was much less how to effectively treat it ... everyone just thought he was crazy so they gave him shock treatments and drugs. It ended up completely disabling him for over a year. For years my dad's condition gnawed away at my mom and made her miserable. Looking back at this I realize that they did the absolute best job that they could considering the circumstances; I also realize just how much they really loved me...but when it was all going down I just couldn't stand being in the house. I became mad at God. I thought that this Jesus loves me and wants to look out for us was a big bunch of BS. My home life was awful and I blamed Him for that. I wanted Him to play by my rules. I was young, selfish and just didn't understand.

I continued on with this mindset for many years. I ended up marrying a few years out of school and we had a baby girl early in the marriage. I never felt anything like this before in my life...he was the most perfect little girl and I found that the faith I had lost somehow returning. I decided that she should be baptized and brought up as Catholic. We started going to church again and continued to attend for a number of years. Back in the early 80's the Catholic church decided that a "revival "was in order and implemented a program called Renewal. It was kind of a small group theme with a study format that they put together. After a few meetings I quickly determined that half of these people didn't really need a small group...they needed to be medicated. I spoke to our priest and found him to be rude, odd and self—absorbed. My wife felt the same way so we checked out...if this is Christianity then I wanted no part of it. Again I had no real understanding of God or how to reach out to Him... such ignorance; I hope that these issues I had with the Catholic Church doesn't offend anyone...they really aren't meant to. I did not attend church again for many years. During this time I read and dabbled in other beliefs, mostly eastern in origin. I even read the Road less Traveled and found it along with everything else I read then unfulfilling and now see it all as just a bunch of crap.

I just continued with this gnawing feeling in my heart that something I needed and wanted was going unfulfilled, a feeling that I remembered having most of my life.

About 14 years ago I found myself divorced and single again, and, yes, it was an awful experience. I was the primary parent, and my son and daughter lived with me. What a true blessing they were to me during this time. Again I started to attend a neighborhood Catholic Church searching once again to fill this hole in my heart and tried to reintroduce my kids to it with mixed results. I went because I didn't know anything else and to a degree found some peace.

As my kids grew I found myself starting to date again and having a ball. It was something like taking the best things about being married but staying single and being very self-centered to boot. I thought I was happy, but still I felt that this couldn't be it. I continued in this lifestyle longer than I care to say.

A long term relationship I was in ended badly and I found myself questioning everything again. Another meeting with a priest was completely fruitless and futile. A good friend of mine called and asked if I would meet him for dinner later in the week; Ed, my friend, had also made his share of mistakes and was able to overcome these issues and get on with his life. A few years earlier Ed had found himself in a similar predicament as me. He was looking for something else and had became active in a Christian church in Webster. When I saw Ed I would sense changes in him...he was different but different in a good way. We had dinner together and he then shared the gospel with me and gave me this Bible.

I started to read it that very evening....I then started going to church with Ed and his wife Beth and truly received Christ about 6 months later. The pastor was preaching a series based on the book of Philippians and everything that was wrong with me and my life became the "past." I was able to move on, forgive others and myself. (See chapter 3) It seemed funny to me at the time, I thought that being a Christian would be confining and dull. I was so very wrong. It has and is the most freeing thing that I have ever experienced. I thank Christ Jesus everyday for putting Himself and eternity in my heart. I was also very fortunate that God put good Christian men in my life that helped me and supported me as I developed. They have been so important in my growth and study in Christ and His Word.

He is all about forgiveness, repentance, relationships and the mending of relationships. I realize that I belong to Him. How does that hymn go...the things of this world grow strangely dim...they really have. He has absolutely and amazingly changed my life. I love to read and study His word...It all makes such perfect sense now.

He has brought this wonderful woman Gayle into my life that wants to know Christ as I do and surrounds me with others like me who seek Him...again I'm so grateful.

I also realize that following Christ seems to take on the notion of two steps forward then one step back sometimes. I do so much better now yet I still screw up more than I'd like to admit. I think of Paul and his letter to the Romans, (by the way he will be the first person I look up when I get to heaven, the second will be the thief on the cross) chapter 7 verses 13 thru 25. Verse 25 is the kicker...our sinful nature and our one and only means of redemption.

Note: With the falling value of the dollar and increasing inflation in most countries, all of our missionaries are facing financial crunches. Pray for the Lord to supply their needs.

- 2. **Rob and Tünde Futo Budapest, Hungary**. Pray for them as they will be leading two conferences this summer. Praise that 70 people have registered for the new Bible school that starts in September. Pray for those who will be attending and teaching.
