### OOC Monthly Income Report

In looking at how we are doing with our church's monthly income through February, we are running pretty close to what was budgeted, which means that with the generous gifts in December we are projected to have a surplus at the end of the year:

We are glad to see that giving amounts have risen to a level that is in line with our current budget, although regular giving is still a bit below. This puts us in good shape for this fiscal year as we have money remaining from our record December giving that will make up for the small monthly shortfalls and still should allow us to have funds remaining. The officers are glad to see that we should not have to make any further cuts and, if the current giving pattern remains, we will have the happy task of discussing how we can use the apparent surplus to restore some of the benevolences, salaries, and ministry expenses that were cut last summer.

We thank you for your generous giving and ask that you continue to share what God has provided you as together we use those resources to increase His kingdom in this world. Please continue to be in prayer for our church's financial situation, and for wisdom for the elders and deacons as we seek to make decisions in line with the Lord's will.

# Vote Yes to Proposition A

The County gets a second chance to do the right thing. On April 6 (Tuesday after Easter), Proposition A will be on the ballot for the second time. As before, the vote has benefits directly for those who can't afford an automobile. The Yes vote means they can get(or continue to get) to work, to shop, to visit family and friends, and do many of the things we just hop in the car and do. And it also can mean that some folks (like me) who have cars, can choose to use them less than they might, and cut pollution of our air.

This vote is not an affirmation of metro transit fiscal shortcomings, or an opportunity to penalize the system. You don't "cut off your nose to spite your face." Our community needs better public transportation. And it certainly can't afford to lose(as in the first vote) any of what it already has. If Prop A does not succeed, we won't have better public transit, we could have even worse than we do. Metro needs income just to maintain the status quo.

Please vote YES on prop A.

## L'Abri Lecture Library Online

The L'Abri audio lecture library started when a student at Swiss L'Abri hid a microphone behind a flower-pot in order to record one of Dr Schaeffer's lectures. Since then lectures and discussions given week by week at the various branches of L'Abri have been recorded and over the past 40 years the library has grown into the thousands. The lectures cover a wide range of topics from art and apologetics, to politics and postmodernism. This reflects L'Abri's central principle that Jesus is Lord of all of life.

Up until now the lectures have mainly been available at the L'Abri study centres, prompting one student to call this resource 'boxed lightning.' Now we hope to let the lightening out of the box by making the lecture library available online at our new website - 'L'Abri Ideas Library'.

To get to the site simply go to the L'Abri homepage at <a href="www.labri.org">www.labri.org</a> and then click on the **Resource** button. There you will find links to some branch tape collections as well as the L'Abri Ideas Library

It currently has over 350 lectures, including over 100 given by Dr Schaeffer, which can be downloaded in mp3 format. We decided to make the downloads free as we wanted to make the resource available regardless of ability to pay. But we also hope those who are able will make a donation for the lecture material and so support the maintenance and improvement of the site.

We will, of course, continue uploading material until our entire back catalogue is available on-line. But in the mean time please remember that the whole collection is already available in a number of different formats from our US distributors SoundWord Associates (see their link also on our Resources page). They will also continue to be the exclusive distributors of all recent Conference lectures.

Dear Old Orchard,

First of all, I want to tell you guys how much I miss all of you and your smiling faces! I love all of you and have been so blessed by your support for me and all of my endeavors. I wanted to let you all know of a trip I am taking for the first six weeks of my summer. I am doing an internship in the Prime Minister's office in Harare, Zimbabwe from May 12-June 25. This was an amazing opportunity that I received from my dad's recent trip to Zimbabwe and the generous hospitality of Mr. Eddie Cross, a Christian man who my dad met who is an MP in the Zimbabwean Parliament and is an elder in a Presbyterian church there. Mr. Cross has offered me housing and this internship for my 6-week stay in Zimbabwe, which I am so thankful for.

Since you are all near and dear to me, I wanted you to know about this exciting opportunity that I am embarking on soon, and wanted to let you know how you can support me as a body. Most importantly, I would appreciate your support for me through prayer. I am very excited for what the Lord is going to teach me on this trip, and how He is going to stretch me, but I know that I will experience times of loneliness and feeling overwhelmed while I'm there. Your prayer for the trip and for my overall well-being would mean a lot to me. Secondly, with air fare and other miscellaneous costs, this trip is going to cost us around \$3500. Although this is a daunting thing, I am confident that the Lord will provide the funds and that He will continue to make this trip possible. # In Honor of Amy Lutjens Memorial Service of Worship on February 20, 2010

There is an empty chair at the table today, an empty chair at the Family table, an empty chair in the fellowship hall—for our friend, Amy, has been called to sit at another table,

... The Table of The Lord.

Yes, an empty chair at our table, and we miss her, oh so much. We miss her radiant smile, the joy of her presence, the warmth of her hospitality, the depth of her generosity, and at the same time, the greatness of her humility. For to sit at table with Amy meant many precious things—not only an abundance of food, the great taste created by the cook, the constant service and the concern for the guests, but there she would be, enhancing the well-being of others and embracing all present with a warm welcome as friend.

We would find her giving in love, in prayer, and in service—"For the Spirit of the Lord was upon her" and she was His servant and helper here on earth.

Her dedication to her Lord was exemplary, and she was a role model of faith: "We need to pray about that," she would often say. Once I called her "one of our prayer warriors" and the heads of all those with me nodded, giving knowing assent. Yes, I knew Amy, knew her to be a person of unshakable commitment, with a great gift of faith, the depth of love and genuine constant desire to be more like the Lord. "I'm sorry," she would all too often say—it was like she was willing to bear the burden and guilt of others in a mysterious Christ-like way. But truly she had little to be sorry for, except of course, that she didn't have more to give for and to her Lord Jesus.

His Spirit was truly upon her to enable her; His Spirit was at work in her to refine her, working to purify her relationship with Him by His presence in heart and home. How often did she not prepare a table for others in her home—and now it's the Lord's turn: "thou preparest a table before me . . ." (Ps 23:5). And the Lord's Spirit has prepared her table through the gift of Himself, and by His presence at His table. For there at the altar she

would meet and dine with the One whom she loved most, the One who poured out His lifeblood for her, and by His sacrifice on the cross opened His arms welcoming her into His eternal embrace. For she found His love irresistible! In trust she answered His invitation to "Come Unto Me ... sit, eat, and be satisfied." She heard and trusted the words of her Savior who said: "I AM the Living Bread from heaven, the Bread that gives life to the world. Eat and be full."

In her life on earth, Amy was always waiting on tables, waiting on others. Now she sits! She sits at the Lord's Messianic Table, at His special Feast of Love. Today she is not the servant, she is His Guest of Honor—the impulse in her is to rise and wait on others. But the Lord speaks lovingly to her—"Amy, Sit and Enjoy. THIS FEAST IS FOR YOU!"

#### **Easter Fare**

From my (still very Canadian) friend who last year gave me a recipe for (the strange Canadian delicacy) Cuban Lunch, here is another (also Canadian) recipe for your (non-Canadian but still American) Easter eating (feel free to use Canadian ingredients):

## Easter Eggs

Cream together:

- 6 tbsp soft butter
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup peanut butter
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup marshmallow cream

Gradually beat in:

- 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup powdered sugar

Drop by level tablespoonfuls onto a baking sheet lined with waxed paper; Form into egg shapes and freeze 10 minutes.

Melt chocolate, dip eggs, and return them to waxed paper. Decorate immediately with sprinkles, and let stand until set. Done! Easy, eh?
