FELLOWSHIP OF THE RING, THE by J.R.R. Tolkien. Does this really need an explanation?

LAST BATTLE, THE by C. S. Lewis, this is not a new book, but an additional copy.

LION, THE WITCH AND THE WARDROBE, THE, by C. S. Lewis, this also is an additional copy.

SON OF HAMAS, by Mosab Hassan Yousef, This is a true story of Mosab Hassan Yousef. Mosab reveals new information about the world's most dangerous terrorist organization and unveils the truth about his own secret role, his agonizing separation from family and homeland, his dangerous choices, and his belief that the mandate to "love your enemies" is the only way to peace in the Middle East.

BATTLE FOR THE BEGINNING, THE, By John MacArthur. Many Christians who claim to believe the Bible seem willing to allow modern scientific theories to replace the Genesis account of creation. MacArthur believes such compromises present a great danger. He asserts that in Genesis 1-3 we find the foundation of every doctrine that is essential to the Christian faith – the vital foundation for everything we believe as Christians. In this book he draws a clear line on today's theological landscape and calls on his readers to help him defend it.

WHEN GOD DOESN'T MAKE SENSE, by Dr. James Dobson. An immensely practical book for those who are struggling with trials and heartaches they can't understand. Why does disease, divorce, rejection, death or sorrow seep into our lives when we are trying to serve the Lord? This book deals unflinchingly with life's most troubling question – "WHY?" Drawing on his long experience as a Christian psychologist Dr. Dobson brings hope to those who have almost given up. WHEN GOD DOESN'T MAKE SENSE also helps believers avoid "the betrayal barrier," the sense that God is abandoning them amidst the storms of life.

SECOND COMING, THE, by John F. Macarthur. This book is a straightforward, in-depth exploration of the key biblical texts regarding the Second Coming, most notably, Christ's longest and most important eschatological message. As you are exposed to the Word of God on these matters, and as you study His Word yourself, it will stir in your heart an earnest longing for Christ's return-as well as a certainty about how to live expectantly until He comes again.

<u>FIRST LOVE</u>, by John MacArthur, Jr. Have you ever felt as though your day-to-day relationship with Christ is stuck on autopilot? Or perhaps serving God has lost its luster as you sense it growing more mechanical and less meaningful. When it comes to your relationship with Christ, have you lost the exciting and motivating first love you once enjoyed? In **FIRST LOVE**, John MacArthur persuasively asserts that what's been lost **CAN** be found. This book can help you restore the fire and conviction of your first love for Christ by helping you develop a clearer understanding of His character, His glory, and His love for you.

<u>ALONE WITH GOD</u>, by John MacArthur, Jr. Prayer anchors the soul while lifting us to the very throne of God. It's the language of heaven and the key to unleashing God's power in our lives. In ALONE WITH GOD, John MacArthur explores the anatomy of effective prayer and presents a refreshing, biblical model, a powerful tool for greater fervency and frequency in your communion with the Lord.

<u>POWER OF SUFFERING, THE</u>, BY John MacArthur Jr. John MacArthur examines the reality of pain and trials in the Christian life and, offers a plausible, thoroughly biblical explanation for the deep valleys each of us inevitably cross. This book will not only help you better understand the unique and important role suffering plays in your life, but it will also equip you to cherish your trials and prepare you to comfort and encourage others!

VANISHING CONSCIENCE, THE, by John MacArthur Jr. The once-clear line between right and wrong has faded to a dismal, uncertain gray. Why? Because psychological double talk and a national obsession with self-esteem and moral neutrality have rendered guilt, sin, and person responsibility obsolete. According to today's wisdom, criminals are not villains at all – they're victims. The author graphically documents the current movement away from the biblical truth about sin, and urges us to find peace and freedom by dealing with sin the way Jesus taught.

LOVE OF GOD, THE, BY John MacArthur Jr. God will do whatever it takes to Make Us Holy. In **THE LOVE OF GOD**, you'll find a passionate, well-argued defense for what the love of God is-and what it is not. **THE LOVE OF GOD** tackles the difficult questions head-on and provides frank, thoroughly biblical answers.

DOROTHY L. SAYERS, Her Life And Soul, by Barbara Reynolds. This is a biography of Dorothy L. Sayers, a writer who created Lord Peter Wimsey, and "*Whose Body*?" She was also an impressive Christian scholar and one of the first women to be awarded a degree from Oxford University.

<u>CHILD'S STORY BIBLE, THE</u>, by Catherine F. Vos. This is a Bible storybook which goes through the Old and New Testament. It is both faithful to the inspired Word of God and successful in conveying the dramatic excitement and human warmth of these most wonderful of all stories. "Let the little children come to Me," He said. "Do not forbid them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to just such as they are." Then Jesus took the little children in His arms, and laid His hands on their heads and blessed them.

LITTLE VISITS WITH GOD, by Allan Hart Jahsmann. This is a book of Devotions for Families with small Children. This book will help children not only to know about God, but also to love Him and to trust in Him. It cultivates right attitudes and shows how the Christian faith is to function in daily living. They touch the heart as well as reach the mind. They are childlike without being childish. They lead to Jesus, the Savior and Good Shepherd. And it is through childlike trust in Jesus that we are saved.

ANGELS WERE SILENT, AND THE by Max Lucado. AND THE ANGELS WERE SILENT takes you on Jesus' final walk. It's the final week. All of heaven watches. It is the long-awaited week. A week when no angel dared sing.

DIFFERENT BY DESIGN by John MacArthur, Jr. Lured by the world's acceptance and a national obsession with fairness, we've replaced the once-clear biblical boundaries between men and women with a confusing, frighteningly secular hybrid. DIFFERENT BY DESIGN sets aside prevailing cultural standards and helps you understand and apply the biblical principles for men's roles.

JESUS STORYBOOK BIBLE, THE, by Sally Lloyd-Jones invites children to discover for themselves that Jesus is at the center of God's great story of salvation-and at the center of their story too.

<u>SHEPHERDING A CHILD'S HEART</u>, by Tedd Tripp. This book is about how to speak to the heart of your child. The things your child does and says flows from the heart. This insightful book provides perspectives and procedures for shepherding your child's heart into the paths of life.

<u>RECKLESS FAITH</u>, by John F. MacArthur. Scripture and reason-the two together comprise the formula for true discernment. Yet in many American churches, reason has been abandoned for something more digestible: faith that feels good. John MacArthur calls this "reckless faith"-and it leads people away from the one true God.

JUST LIKE JESUS, by Max Lucado. Where did we get this idea that we can't change? And thus come statements such as, "It's just my nature to worry."; "I can't help the way I react." Such thoughts are not from God. God loves you just the way you are, but he refuses to leave you there. He wants you to have a heart like his. He wants you to be JUST LIKE JESUS.

Foreign Missions Prayer Requests for October, 2011

1. Jon and Tanya Coody – St. Petersburg, Russia. Praise that their support level is nearly to 50% after an encouraging trip last month. Pray for open doors and new partners. Pray for Tanya, as she endured some emergency dental issues during the trip and will have more work done this week (10/4).

2. Wilma Cross – Santiago, Chile. Pray for physical and spiritual strength and protection as Wilma has a heavy schedule of teaching seminars, speaking and counseling. She plans to spend November in the US spending time with her elderly mother. Pray that the Lord will guide others to help in the various aspects of her ministry. Pray for someone to help prepare the DVD's that have been made of her seminars.

3. **Rob and Tünde Futo – Budapest, Hungary.** Pray for an evangelistic outreach from their church this month, with difficult topics being discussed by Rob each Sunday night. Pray that people will respond to posters advertising these events. Pray that the Lord will help Tunde overcome some copyright issues that have arisen over music in the Christmas CD that the choir is hoping to distribute soon.

4. Gerry and Ruth Gutierrez – Huanta, Peru. Praise the Lord that the doctor's last report on Ruthie's condition (8/21) is that the cancer is not advancing. We have no news since then. Pray for God's continued grace for Ruthie, Gerry and the family, that they will all be strengthened to accept God's will for Ruthie's life, whatever that is.

5. L'Abri Fellowship – England and Switzerland. Pray for both students and staff as the fall terms get under way. Pray for good relations between the guests. Pray that the staff will be sensitive to the needs of the students and have wisdom in dealing with them. Pray for the Lord's provision for financial needs, especially in the Swiss branch.

6. Dawn Miller – Madrid, Spain. Pray for Dawn for wisdom as she juggles studies at Covenant and ministry with college students at SLU through Cru (the new name for Campus Crusade). Pray for wisdom in saying yes and no to various commitments. Pray for Brigid and Liz who recently trusted Christ. Pray also for Juhyan (Ju) and Jing as they consider Christ and recently attended the Cru fall getaway.

7. Joseph and Elfi Muutuki – Nairobi, Kenya. Pray that a godly Indian pastor can be found to pastor the multi-racial church that Joe as founded. Also pray that a good, Christian permanent home can be found for Inishma, the young girl who the Muutuki's rescued from an abusive father (who has since died).

8. Luciano and Luciene Pires – Goiania, Brazil. Praise that they have found and already moved into a new (to them) apartment that is very suitable for both their work and their family. It is larger than their former house and expenses will be less. Pray for provision for moving expenses and for adjusting to life in a new location.

9. Rene and Lani Quimbo – Mindanao, Philippines. Praise that Lani was spared a potentially serious health problem last month. Pray that the work will continue to be fruitful in their various places of ministry, both among students, poor Muslim families and farmers in the mountains. Pray that new believers will grow and withstand temptations. Also pray for the Lord to meet their financial needs.

10. Joel and Jessica Rinn – Verona, Italy. Pray that the Verona Bible studies will begin this month in an appropriate location and that there will be new participants. Pray for the church plant with military personnel in Vicenza, that an appropriate location for worship will be found. Pray for more financial support.

In addition to the ministry of the word we have planned a thoughtful service of worship that will highlight the great doctrines of the Reformation and include the celebration of the Lord's Supper.

A nursery is available for children up through age 2 and a **children's church** program will be offered for children age 4 thru 3rd grade. Those interested in singing in the **joint choir** can come for rehearsal at 4pm.

Please extend this opportunity for mutual encouragement to all the members of your congregation and make plans to join together on October 30 to glorify and worship the *Mighty Fortress who is our God*!
