# Our Children's Ministry

**Nursery** is offered for infants & children through kindergarten age. Our nurseries are in the church building basement.

- ❖Infant nursery for babies, crawlers, & very early walkers.
- **Toddler nursery** for children who are walking up to three years of age. Children who turn three from January-August are invited to attend preschool worship starting September 1. Children who turn three from September-December are invited to attend preschool worship starting January 1.
- **Preschool worship** for age 3 through Kindergarten. Three-year-olds (see above) and four-year-olds are welcome during the whole service. Five-year-olds remain upstairs in the worship service until dismissed at 10:50.
- **♦ Children's Worship**: Children in grades 1-5 will be dismissed to the Milligan House around 11:50 a.m.. Listen for dismissal announcement, usually around 10:50 am. See Mark Robertson for guestions.

We are providing gifts to families adopted through Webster-Rock Hill Ministries, children of prisoners served by Mission Gate, a prison ministry, and gifts to children/grandchildren of homeless women who are guests of the Grace & Peace Winter Shelter. These are represented by ornaments on our tree; please leave the second half of the ornament or the gold tag of the angels with your name in the brown envelope so we know who took the gifts.

We are also looking for **food items** for a Christmas dinner (and general non-perishables) and monetary contributions to add to our gift giving, including utility gifts for the families served by Webster-Rock Hill Ministries. Suggested food items for the families:

For Christmas Dinner: Corn, green beans, cranberry sauce, Yams/sweet potatoes, canned fruit, instant gelatin, instant (or fresh) potatoes, stuffing mix, cake mix, cake frosting.

Additional non-perishable items to help stock the families' pantries. Remember, we have adopted: two families with children and two individuals. See below for brief description.

<u>Families</u>: One is a single mom with an 8 year old old daughter; the orner family is a single mom with 4 children (ages 21, 19, 18 (these three are all students) and a 2 year old. We also adopted two other individuals: a senior who recently had a stroke, and a disabled adult.

#### **End of the Year Contributions**

The last Sunday you can drop gifts in the collection plate and have them applied to the year 2011 for tax purposes is <u>Sunday</u>, <u>December 25, 2011</u>. Anything put in the collection plate after that will be counted as part of your giving in the year 2012, even if you back-date the check. IRS rules for tax deductions stipulate that gifts must be given by December 31—in the hands of the church by midnight, December 31, or postmarked in 2011 (if they are being mailed) though not received by the church until 2012.

#### Foreign Missions Prayer Requests for December 2011

- 1. Jon and Tanya Coody St. Petersburg, Russia. They may need to move out of their present housing in January. Pray for a place for them to stay. The rector of the university in St P (who is Jon's primary connection there) is leaving for a sabbatical in the US in July. Pray that the Coodys will be able to leave by March so that Jon will have time to work with this man. They are now at 60-65% of needed support.
- 2. Wilma Cross Santiago, Chile. Wilma was to return to Chile on Dec 1 after a month in the US. Pray for a quick readjustment to life in Chile and for plans for activities for Christmas. Pray for wisdom for Wilma in her counseling.
- 3. Rob and Tünde Futo Budapest, Hungary. Pray for three large outreach concerts that the choir will be giving (two on Dec 11 and one on Dec 16). Pray for calm for Tünde as she faces the inevitable crises! Pray also for the CD that has been released. Also, Ron has a book on marriage coming out this month. Pray that the lives of many Hungarians will be blessed through these things.
- **4. Gerry and Ruth Gutierrez Huanta, Peru.** Gerry and Ruthie have asked us to pray that the Lord would give them another opportunity to participate in the Lord's harvest in Peru. Though the doctors have said that the cancer is not advancing, Ruthie is suffering a great deal and Gerry is caring for her and serving as housekeeper and cook.
- 5. L'Abri Fellowship England and Switzerland. As the term ends this month in both branches, pray for the students as they leave, that positive changes that have occurred in their lives will remain. Pray for staff during the break, for rest and spiritual renewal over Christmas. Pray for financial needs in Switzerland.
- **6. Dawn Miller Madrid, Spain.** Pray for Dawn for wisdom as she juggles studies at Covenant Seminary and ministry at St. Louis University with Cru (Campus Crusade). Pray for individual students to whom Dawn has ministered. Pray for the ongoing spread of the Gospel among students in Madrid.
- **7. Joseph and Elfi Muutuki Nairobi, Kenya.** Pray that the Lord will bring to pass potential steps forward in the work there: the possibility of an Indian pastor and also an American missionary couple through SIM (Sudan Interior Mission?) to work with them. Praise for financial encouragement.

They have gone through many difficulties in the last month: cancer surgery for Luciene's mother; the death of Luciene's uncle; helping her parents move; a temporary evacuation from their own new apartment due to a gas leak; financial concerns, etc. Praise that the surgery went well and finances have eased. Pray that Luciano's diabetes will get/stay under control.
- **9. Rene and Lani Quimbo Mindanao, Philippines.** Pray for protection, wisdom and spiritual and physical strength for the Quimbos as they need to deal with many difficult situations in their widespread, fruitful ministries. Pray for fruitful Christmas celebrations in the various branches. Also pray for the Lord to meet their pressing financial needs.
- **10. Joel and Jessica Rinn Verona, Italy.** Pray that the Lord will protect and encourage them as this month will be filled with many activities. Pray for their health; they have been suffering from the flu. Pray for new, solid contacts for the work in Verona. Pray that the church plant in Vicenza with American military personnel will go forward. Pray for financial needs.
