### Our Children's Ministry

**Nursery** is offered for infants & children through kindergarten age. Our nurseries are in the church building basement.

- Infant nursery for babies, crawlers, & very early walkers.
- **Toddler nursery** for children who are walking up to three years of age. Children who turn three from January-August are invited to attend preschool worship starting September 1. Children who turn three from September-December are invited to attend preschool worship starting January 1.
- **Preschool worship** for age 3 through Kindergarten. Three-year-olds (see above) and four-year-olds are welcome during the whole service. Five-year-olds remain upstairs in the worship service until they are dismissed at 10:50.
- Children's Worship For children in grades 1-5 meeting at Milligan House. Listen for dismissal announcement, usually around 10:50 am. See Jessie Swigart or Mark Robertson for questions.

### Maundy Thursday and Maundy Thursday Meals

Maundy Thursday. The word "Maundy" is derived from the Latin word mando, mandare, "I command." The connection seems to be John 13, where Jesus washes the disciples' feet, and eventually says, in v. 34, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another." Given that the foot-washing came on the Thursday before the crucifixion, "Maundy Thursday" apparently commemorates that first Thursday night when Jesus gave his disciples the new commandment to love each other.

#### Maundy Thursday Meals – Thursday, April 5, 2012

As is our custom, we will gather in homes for a simple meal during Holy Week, but this year again, to enable us to focus more easily, we will not do our meals on Good Friday but on Maundy Thursday. Meals will begin at 6:15 p.m.

There are two types of meals, sharing meals and reciting meals. In a sharing meal there is open sharing with each other how Christ's finished work on the cross is having its effect on us, right where we live. In a reciting meal we read to each other the dramatic story (highlighted from Genesis to Revelation) of our rebellion and God's redemption. We encourage you to bring non-Christian friends to these meals. We have 10 hosts this year so there's room for 62 guests!

There will be a special meal for children starting at 6:00 p.m. (divided ages: 1-4; 5-11 years) at the Milligan House during these adult meals. Sign up sheets are in the parlor.
