Guests, we welcome you and thank you for coming! We invite you to use our **child care services** for infants through children in kindergarten, located in the church building basement. Our Children's Ministry

Nursery is offered for infants & children through kindergarten age. Our nurseries are in the church building basement.

- ♦ Infant nursery for babies, crawlers, & very early walkers.
- ❖Toddler nursery for children who are walking up to three years of age. Children who turn three from January-August are invited to attend preschool worship starting September 1. Children who turn three from September-December are invited to attend preschool worship starting January 1.
- ❖ Preschool worship for age 3 through Kindergarten. Three-year-olds (see above) and four-year-olds are welcome during the whole service. Five-year-olds remain upstairs in the worship service until dismissed at 10:50.
- **♦ Children's Worship.** For children in grades 1-5 meeting at Milligan House. Listen for dismissal announcement, usually around 10:50 am. See Jessie Swigart or Mark Robertson.

Make Use of the Children's Activity Bags in Worship:

Parents, each week there is a new activity sheet for children in the colored bags that you can find in a box alongside the windows in the hallway. These sheets are a way to help children engage in worship; if they are not yet reading, perhaps you can assist them after the service with some of the questions, though there are also graphics and games for all to enjoy according to that week's theme. 


Meets at **9:00 a.m.** for both adults and children. Remember, no classes on November 25, the Sunday after Thanksgiving.



Meet the Reed Family- Chip, Kelsey, McKenna (7) and Murrin (5)

Chip and I met in Castle Rock, CO, in 2000. I had recently graduated from Colorado State University - planning, then, to rejoin World Harvest Mission in Dublin, Ireland (my family had served with WHM in Dublin when I was a teen). Chip was working under my dad as a youth a family ministries director. We began getting to know one another while serving in worship leadership together. I admired his clear, strong voice, and his wisdom and heart for the gospel...he seemed to think I was pretty okay, too...We were married in June, 2001.

I had obviously come from a ministry background, but Chip grew up in very different surroundings. The culture that surrounded him in youth had high esteem for sports - and Chip had the athletic gift. He was accomplished in every sport he turned his hand to, concentrating on football and golf. But the Lord made it obvious for him, in college, that "successful athlete" was not the picture He had in mind for Chip. He became passionate about the gospel - evangelizing out of the joy within - particularly concerned about young people and their knowledge of God's saving work for them. Eventually, Chip attended Covenant College, working several jobs to allow him to work in part-time youth ministry, ultimately pursuing the youth position under my dad.

After a couple of years in his first vocational ministry position in Colorado, he began to feel the Lord moving us on to further ministry preparation, including a pastoral internship in Western North Carolina. While preparing for seminary in 2004, we found ourselves expecting our first child, McKenna, and put our move on hold. Two years and two girls later (Murrin was born in 2006), we finally moved to St. Louis.

Our family landed at Covenant Theological Seminary with thoughts that Chip might switch from the MDiv program (into which he'd been accepted) to the MAC. Instead of making the switch, however, we began planning on a double degree for Chip. So, about halfway through Chip's MDiv, I began studies as well, falling in love with the Educational Ministries program. Unfortunately, we were unable to follow through for Chip and me to complete the extra degrees—though we thoroughly benefited from the taste of each of these programs. Instead, Chip graduated in 2011 with his MDiv.

We are in a season of transition. After graduation, we moved into a friend's home for a few months and into Maplewood, last November. With setbacks in our original plans, our ministry goals and dreams are reforming by the Spirit's guidance. In the meantime, Chip continues work in residential maintenance at CTS, as well as engaging in some renovation work in the house we rent. He and I also serve part-time as a writing team for Docent Research Group, supplying small-group curriculum, sermon research & illustrations to pastors with whom we are matched. Our girls are in Maplewood-Richmond Heights schools, Kindergarten & 2nd grade, possibly for a full two-year loop while we think and pray over next steps.

I'd like to tell you a little bit about myself: My husband and I moved to Saint Louis from the Oklahoma City area in January. My husband is a full-time student at Covenant Seminary pursuing his Masters in Divinity. I've worked some since we've been here, but my primary place this past year or so has been staying home with our 14 month old daughter. We've been attending Grace & Peace Fellowship since June/July. We feel very blessed to have found such a church to call home as long as we're in Saint Louis.

The Shelter opens on November 7th....and closes on March 12th....One more thing to mention is that Shelter Training is November 3rd from 9am-3:30pm.
