Our Children's Ministry

Nursery is offered for infants & children through kindergarten age. Our nurseries are in the church building basement.

- Infant nursery for babies, crawlers, & very early walkers.
- Toddler nursery for children who are walking up to three years of age. Children who turn three from January-August are invited to attend preschool worship starting September 1. Children who turn three from September-December are invited to attend preschool worship starting January 1.
- **Preschool worship** for age 3 through Kindergarten. Three-year-olds (see above) and four-year-olds are welcome during the whole service. Five-year-olds remain upstairs in the worship service until they are dismissed at 10:50.
- Children's Worship for children in grades 1-5 meeting at Milligan House. Listen for dismissal announcement, usually around 10:50 am. See Jessie Swigart or Mark Robertson for questions.
- Make Use of the Children's Activity Bags in Worship! Parents, each week

there is a new activity sheet for children in the colored bags that you can find in a box alongside the windows in the hallway. These sheets are a way to help children engage in worship; if they are not yet reading, perhaps you can assist them after the service with some of the questions, though there are also graphics and games for all to enjoy according to that week's theme. Let me know if you have suggestions, as we seek to help the whole family worship well on Sunday morning!

• A Devotional Book for Families Pastor Mark has created a book, entitled The Handbook, to help families teach their children about Christ. There are copies of this booklet at the back of the church, one for each family. Pastor Mark has describe the rationale behind the book as such: While we take the teaching of your children in the church very seriously, it is in the home where their character is primarily shaped. Families come in all different shapes and sizes, and no two families will look just alike, but the common theme I hope we all share is the instruction in the Lord, and the modeling of a Spirit-filled life. While we can push books in front of them, or spell out theological truths in detail, it is the example in homes where Christ is at the center that will be the most influential force in their lives. This little booklet is an idea-starter and a reminder of God's command to pass on the knowledge of God's redemption to our children.

We will not hide them from their children; we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, his power, and the wonders he has done.

Foreign Missions Prayer Requests for January 2013

- 1. Jon and Tanya Coody St. Petersburg, Russia. Pray for Jon as he teaches in the St. Petersburg Christian University, preparing men to serve in the churches there. Pray especially as he ministers to a separate group of men, many of whom are from difficult backgrounds, who are already pastors. Pray for Tanya and the children as they endure the cold and lack of sunshine.
- 2. Wilma Cross Santiago, Chile. Praise for the changed lives that result from Wilma's ministry. [See FM Bulletin Board] Pray for spiritual and physical strength as she leads seminars and ministers to individuals. Pray for the Lord to touch hearts to support her financially. As of November, she had received just over half of what was needed in 2012 for her personal support as well as the cost of the ministry.
- **3. Rob and Tünde Futo Budapest, Hungary.** Praise for successful Christmas concerts. Pray for difficult situations in their local church, that Rob would have patience and wisdom. Pray for Rob in his busy schedule teaching, preaching and leading of various outreach activities in Budapest.
- **4. Gerry Gutierrez Huanta, Peru.** Pray for Gerry as he serves the Lord in whatever capacity the Lord directs him and the mission board. Pray that the specific ministry that the Lord has for him will clarify as time goes on. Pray for comfort as he continues to grieve and adjust to the loss of Ruthie.
- 5. L'Abri Fellowship England and Switzerland. In Switzerland, the new term began January 3rd. Pray for a good mix of students and wisdom and energy for the staff. Pray for needed funds. Pray for those who care for Mrs. Schaeffer (age 98!) on a daily basis. In England, the new term begins January 28th. Pray for good rest for the staff and that the Lord will bring the students of His choice. In both branches, pray for sufficient staff.
- **6. Dawn Miller Madrid, Spain.** As Dawn is making plans to return to Spain (after she finishes at Covenant), pray for a team of five to go with her. Pray for her witness to her family while she is here. Pray for the women (and their husbands) in the Hispanic Bible study she is teaching here. From Spain, pray for Fran and Pepe as they are looking for work while studying in Paris...that they will see their need for the Gospel.

- 7. Joseph and Elfi Muutuki Nairobi, Kenya. Praise that after several years of hard work, Joseph has completed his dissertation! Pray for his teaching at Daystar University and that the church will be a means of reconciliation among different communities (such as Hindus, Sikhs and Muslims) many of them from India. Pray for Elfi as she works with the women's fellowship groups.
- 8. Luciano and Luciene Pires Goiania, Brazil. Praise that several churches have committed to or shown interest in giving ongoing financial support. Pray that these churches and individuals will follow through and gifts will arrive. Pray for their final days in the US (they leave Jan 21) including a visit to OOC on Jan 20. Pray for funds for their immediate needs and their readjustment to life in Brazil.
- 9. Rene and Lani Quimbo Mindanao, Philippines. Praise for \$1,938 that was given by individuals at OOC that has been sent for the typhoon relief! They will use these funds to replace crops in their "work for food" program. Pray that many of the trees and other crops can be saved. - 10. Joel and Jessica Rinn Verona, Italy. Pray for further contact with a German man (Adrian) who Joel shared the Gospel with on an airplane trip. Pray that in the church plant in Vicenza a Bible Study will develop. Pray for contacts Joel and Jessica have had with Italian unbelievers in their home town: Emanuela and Pilar (mothers at the children's schools) and Mario and Renza. Pray for the Lord to work in their hearts.

Great News From Cornerstone! And Many Thanks!

As many of you know Cornerstone Corporation has been working hard to finish our Stone of Hope property by mid March. Besides the upstairs that is already rented to a family, the downstairs will provide two efficiency apartments for women transitioning from the Grace and Peace homeless women's winter shelter. The amount of funds needed and the amount of work to restore the dilapidated building were great. Despite these challenges the Lord has answered all of our prayers in a powerful way. We sent

out a newsletter in the last two weeks of December stating that we still needed around \$12,000 to finish the building. In those two weeks we received numerous donations and as of December 31, 2012 by 3:00 pm we had received just over the \$12,000! Praise the Lord! Through the countless hours of volunteer sweat equity, a committed group of prayer warriors, and the overwhelming generosity of individuals/churches/foundations we have raised enough funds to complete this building on schedule, Lord willing. Through this effort of so many Cornerstone is able to continue extending hope through the love of Christ and the provision of safe and affordable housing. Nominations for Deaconess, Deacon or Elder

When we nominate: During the months of January and February. (It's that time of year again!)

Who nominates: Any adult member of Old Orchard Church can nominate candidates. But four other members must also join in the nomination.

Who gets nominated: Any man who is a member of Old Orchard Church who is thought to be qualified for either the office of elder or deacon, and any woman who is a member and thought to be qualified for the ministry of deaconess—all according to the criteria set out in the Word of God (deacon: Acts 6:1-6; I Timothy 3:8-10, 12-13; deaconess: I Timothy 3:11; Romans 16:1-2; elder: 1 Timothy 3:1-7; Titus 1:5-9; 1 Peter 5:1-4.) TO NOMINATE SOMEONE MEANS YOU BELIEVE HE OR SHE MAY WELL HAVE THE GIFTS AND CALLING TO BE A DEACON, ELDER, OR DEACONESS, AND SHOULD EXPLORE THIS WITH THE SESSION BY ENTERING THE APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM.

<u>The nomination itself</u>: The nomination must be in writing, must include a statement as to why the nominator believes the person should be considered, must be signed by the nominator and four other members of Old Orchard Church, and must be turned in directly to an elder.

Whom to approach in a nomination: The member nominating should first approach the Session with a written nomination, not the person being nominated. The Session will then take the nomination and approach the individual with it. This is not "going behind the person's back;" but rather, by allowing the elders to approach people with the fact that at least five members of the fellowship believe they may have the gifts and calling for this work, we heighten the need for them to seriously consider it before the Lord. If, after careful prayer and discussion with the elders and others, the nominated person concludes God is not calling him or her at least to go through the apprenticeship program, the nomination can be declined, or postponed, and that is the end of the matter.

Either the Session or the person nominated will inform all signatories to the nomination as to whether or not the nomination is being accepted and the apprenticeship entered.

<u>Apprenticeship period</u>: Those people nominated have through March to think, pray, meet with other officers and with the Session as they try to discern God's leading as to whether to go into the apprenticeship program. The apprenticeship may begin as soon as all those considering it have made up their minds. But it shall be under way **no later than April 1**, and goes through October.

<u>Time of elections</u>: Elections shall normally be held in mid-November.
