Our Children's Ministry: worship time

Nursery is offered for infants & children through kindergarten age. Our nurseries are in the church building basement.

- Infant nursery for babies, crawlers, & very early walkers.
- **Toddler nursery** for children who are walking up to three years of age. Children who turn three from January-August are invited to attend preschool worship starting September 1. Children who turn three from September-December are invited to attend preschool worship starting January 1.
- **Preschool worship** for age 3 through Kindergarten. Three-year-olds (see above) and four-year-olds are welcome during the whole service. Five-year-olds remain upstairs in the worship service until they are dismissed at 10:50.
- Children's Worship resumes today, September 8th, for children in grades 1st through 5th, at the Milligan House. Please see Jessie Swigart or Mark Robertson with questions.
- Children's Activity Bags in Worship! Parents, each week there is a new activity sheet for children in the colored bags which are in a box alongside the windows in the back hallway. These sheets are a way to help children engage in worship; if they are not yet reading, perhaps you can assist them after the service with some of the questions, though there are also graphics and games for all to enjoy according to that week's theme. Let me know if you have suggestions, as we seek to help the whole family worship well Sunday mornings!

Join us for a new adult Sunday School beginning September 8th at 9 a.m. at the Milligan House. We will be thinking about and discussing a series by Tim Keller titled: "The Gospel in Life: Grace Changes Everything." The topics covered in the 8-week series are: city, heart, idolatry, community, witness, work, justice and eternity.
