Grace & Peace Winter Shelter Opportunities

Grace & Peace Fellowship in St. Louis City operates a homeless shelter; here are some opportunities available to serve there. The Shelter is slated to open its 22nd consecutive winter of sheltering homeless women in Jesus' name from November 4, 2007-March 17, 2008.

Staff Positions. The Shelter is in need of two additional adult Christians to complete our Staff team. Shelter Staff can be men or women who can be available one night per week (in this case Sunday night or Tuesday night) from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. starting the opening date (Nov. 4) through closing date March 17, 2008. This is a part-time position which pays \$50 per night and provides for sleep as circumstances allow. (Sleep is scheduled from 10:30 p.m. to 5 a.m.) Qualified candidates will have some experience living and/or working in a city environment, have good communication skills in written and verbal English, and desire to be part of a hospitality ministry team.

Breakfast Teams. The Shelter is looking for Sunday morning breakfast teams of 3 to 8 people. Groups come to prepare and serve breakfast to Grace & Peace Winter Shelter guests (20 plus the team if you want to eat with guests). The team arrives around 7:15 a.m., serve around 7:50, clean up the dishes and leave, usually by 8:50 or earlier. The menu is definitely up to the team that's coming. Old Orchard was given four dates to consider filling, and December 2 and January 6 are still open—but if you can't serve one of those two dates, we can check with the Shelter to see if another date is open. For this opportunity, you'll need to let Durinda know you want a date before contacting Melody at the Shelter.
