Grace & Peace Winter Shelter

Grace & Peace Fellowship in St. Louis City operates a homeless shelter; here are some opportunities available to serve there. The Shelter was slated to open its 22nd consecutive winter of sheltering homeless women in Jesus' name on November 4, 2007, but was delayed due to needing additional staff coverage until November 7. The Shelter will remain open until March 17, 2008. When the Housing Resource Center was told that Grace & Peace was going to open, the Assistant Director was pleased to hear that because there were no open beds in the City.

The last news we received said, "We {at the Shelter] still have quite a few overnight volunteer needs for after Thanksgiving and after December 1. Please pray that those who can take these, will, and those who can't, will keep praying. Thank you!"

At the same time, my intention is to ease over into ministry that focuses on preaching, teaching and training adults to engage in outreach ministry. Also, I am confident that our youth and family ministry is stable enough that volunteers and interns can oversee some of the routine and administrative activities. This would free me up to do what I long to do and what I believe would be helpful to OOC, namely developing our calling to be salt and light in the world. The details of how this might work out are still being determined. One thing that is key is finding people to step up and assume some of the duties of the youth and family ministries (teaching teen Sunday School, overseeing the Children's Good Friday meal, overseeing the Sunday Night Teen Fellowship, etc). Please be praying for the Session as we discuss this, and please bring us your thoughts, ideas, and concerns.
