House Church: An International Perspective Wednesday, April 1

Our guest at house church this month will be Old Orchard Church member, **Jessica Patterson** (she chose to keep her connection to our fellowship, since she knew she would be moving every couple of years).

After graduating from Covenant Seminary in 2002, Jessica worked in the State Department's Office to Monitor and Combat Trafficking in Persons until September of 2003 when she joined the U.S. Foreign Service. She served at the U.S. Embassy in Tel Aviv from 2004-2006 as a Consular Officer in the first year, and as Staff Aide to the United States Ambassador to Israel during the year of the Israeli disengagement from Gaza. In 2006 she moved to Chile where she was a Political/Economic Officer working on transnational crime issues, and telecommunications and civil aviation issues. She returned to Washington D.C. in 2008, and is currently serving as the State Department's Algeria and Tunisia Desk Officer.

We've asked Jessica to talk a little about what it's been like to represent our civil government in different parts of the world as a believer in Jesus Christ, and also to share her insights on current issues in the Middle East, particularly on the recent fighting between Palestinians and Israelis in Gaza.

Come out & listen to Jessica as a small step in learning more about the wide world in which God is working so that we can pray with greater understanding.
